



We Have a Handheld Phone Ban!

The Virginia General Assembly mandated that traffic safety organizations like DRIVE SMART Virginia shall develop and provide educational materials to the public regarding the provisions of this act prior to its effective date.

The effective date was delayed for six months in order to provide the time to deliver this education to the public.





- Created the Hands-Free Virginia Advisory Council in order to ensure that educational programming would meet the needs of all residents in a fair and inclusive way.
- Leveraged the Virginia Partners for Safe Driving, a group of businesses, organizations, and government entities committed to encourage safe driving behaviors to help raise awareness of the new law.
- Developed a communications plan based upon a variety of strategies to reach diverse audiences, including paid and organic social media, roadway signage, variable messaging signs, radio and digital PSAs, press conferences, print materials, a dedicated website and more.



New Virginia Law Effective Statewide January 1, 2021 Partnered with the Virginia Highway Safety Office to create the campaign.

The message needed to be clean and direct.

In the event that you are pulled over for holding a handheld personal communications device, act in the same manner you would for any traffic stop. You will NOT be asked to hand the device over to the officer. Keep in mind that WHAT you are doing with the device is irrelevant, it is the act of HOLDING the device while driving that is illegal.

Breaking The Law Will Cost You

A person who violates 46.2-818.2 is subject to a fine of \$125 for the first offense and \$250 for the second and subsequent offenses. A person who is convicted of reckless driving who was also in violation of 46.2-818.2 when committing the offense can be fined up to \$2,500, up to 12 months in jail, and up to a six month license suspension, but shall be fined a mandatory minimum fine of \$250. A person who violates this law while driving in a highway work zone shall be fined \$250.



Effective January 1, 2021, it will be illegal to hold a handheld personal communications device (e.g., your smartphone) while driving a moving motor vehicle on Virginia highways. This new law is one of many ways the state is buckling down on distracted driving.

What's Off-Limits?


While driving, it will be illegal to hold a mobile device in your hand while doing some activities, such as:

- Dialing a phone number;
- Sending a text message;
- Updating/browsing social media;
- Video conferencing;

- · Shopping online;
- Watching movies;
- Checking the weather;
- Playing games;
- · And more.

The Five Exceptions

- The operator of any emergency vehicle while he/she is engaged in the performance of his/her official duties;
- An operator who is lawfully parked or stopped;
- Any person using a handheld personal communications device in order to report an emergency;
- 4. The use of an amateur or a citizens band radio; or
- The operator of any Department of Transportation related vehicle during the performance of traffic incident management services.





Can I Still Use Bluetooth?

This new law does not prohibit making or receiving phone calls using "hands-free" technology, such as Bluetooth or integrated systems within the motor vehicle. Simply said, you cannot hold your phone while driving for any reason. If you must use your device, we encourage you to pull over to a safe location and park your car before handling.





 Virginia Tech Transportation Institute (VTTI)

In a Liberty Mutual survey, 80% of teens reported that they viewed APP use while driving as "not distracting." - **Liberty Mutual Research Institute for Safety**

"Motorists with smartphones use handheld devices in 88 out of every 100 trips. Therefore, Zendrive estimates that there are about 600 million trips involving distracted driving in the United States every day." - **Zendrive**

Virginia Trucking Association

The Virginia Trucking Association shared information during truck driver appreciation event. Placed signage at weigh stations. Sent the word out to members.



DRIVE SMART Virginia produced a 30-second PSA. The Virginia Association of Broadcasters distributed the PSA to its 230 member radio stations.


